ADVERTISEMENT (KUALA SELANGOR DISTRICT COUNCIL) BY-LAWS 2007

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 102 of the Local Government Act 1976 [Act 171], the Kuala Selangor District Council makes, and pursuant to section 103 of the Act, the State Authority confirms the following by-laws:

Short title, application and commencement

1. (1) This By-Laws may be cited as the **Advertisement (Kuala Selangor District Council) By-Laws 2007**.

(2) This By-Laws shall apply only to the area administered by the Kuala Selangor District Council.

(3) This By-Laws comes into operation on 19 July 2007.

Interpretation

2. (1) In this by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—

“registered architect” means a person registered under the Architect Act 1967 [Act 117];

“fee” means fee prescribed in the First Schedule;

“advertisement” means any notification, intimation or publication exhibited, displayed or erected for the purpose of bringing to the notice of the public any article, production, trade, business, profession, firm, corporation, organization, institution, place, premises, event, activity, information or any other matter, on any hoarding, electronic box, board, roof, wall, paling, fence, tree, frame, plate, cloth, bar, pillar, post, wire, casing or any other structure of contrivance or any part thereof, on, in or over any land and includes sky sign, balloon, backdrop, banner, poster, directional sign or signboard but does not include election advertisement;

“illuminated advertisement” means any advertisement which is being illuminated from within a structure or frame of the advertisement itself by electric light such as ball lamp, fluorescent, neon and spotlight or other apparatus fixed, outside the structure or frame which emits light toward the advertisement resulting it to be seen clearly at night time;

“non illuminated advertisement” means any advertisement other than illuminate advertisement;

“election advertisement” shall have the same meaning assigned to it under the Election Advertisement (Kuala Selangor District Council) By-Laws 1990 [Sel. P.U. 47/90];

“registered civil engineer” or “registered structural engineer” means a person registered as such under the Registration of Engineers Act 1967 [Act 138];

“licence” means a licence issued under this by-laws;

“sign board” means any board which displays the name or the registered trade mark of any person, firm, corporation or organization, the nature of trade, business or profession carried on by such person, firm, corporation or organization;

“licencing authority” means the Mayor, President, Secretary or any officer authorized in writing by the Mayor or President;

“licensee” means a person to whom the licence is issued under this by-laws;

“Council” means the Kuala Selangor District Council;

“poster” means an advertisement measuring not more than sixty centimeters by ninety centimeters and not of permanent in nature;

“directional sign” means a display in any manner the registered trade mark or the nature of the trade, business or profession of any person, firm, corporation or organization and intended to point the way to the premises where a sign board would not be visible from the street;

“poster stand” means a stand provided by the Council for display of posters; and

“sky sign” means any erection consisting of a frame, hoarding, board, bar, pillar, post, wire or any combination thereof, any erection of like nature, any visible object which floats or is kept in position by other flexible attachment, displayed for the purpose of trade or professional advertisement, in such position as to be conspicuously visible against the sky from any street or public place.

(2) In this by-laws, reference to the person exhibiting an advertisement shall be construed as a reference to the person who, by himself, servant or agent, exhibits or cause to be exhibited such advertisement and shall be deemed to include—

- (a) the owner or the occupier of the land on which the advertisement is displayed; and
- (b) any person, firm, corporation or organization in respect of whose goods, trade, business, profession, events or other concerns, publicity is given by the advertisement.

PART II

LANGUAGE OF ADVERTISEMENT

Language of advertisement

3. (1) The national language shall be used for all advertisements whether by itself or together with any other language.

(2) If the national language is used together with any other language in an advertisement, the words in the national language shall be—

- (a) thirty percent larger than the other language in measurement;
- (b) prominently displayed; and
- (c) grammatically correct.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with paragraph (1) or (2) shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or both.

(4) Notwithstanding paragraph (3), if the name of the firm, corporation, company, society, co-operative society or any other organization as registered under the Registration of Business Act 1956 [Act 179], Companies Act 1965 [Act 125], the Societies Act 1966 [Act 335] or the Co-operative Societies Act 1993 [Act 502] does not comprise of or include words in the national language, such words need not be translated into the national language.

Correct use of the national language

4. (1) If it appears to the licencing authority that the national language has not been used correctly in any advertisement, the licencing authority may by notice in writing order the person who has exhibited, erected, caused or permit the advertisement to be exhibited or erected, to alter the advertisement so as to correct the error in such manner and within such time as the licencing authority may specify in the notice.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with the notice issued by the licencing authority shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or both.

Advertisement of liquor

5. Any premise selling food or beverages which displays any advertisement of liquor or alcoholic beverages shall—

- (a) display the advertisement in the premises only; and
- (b) the advertisement shall not be larger than the main advertisement.

Usage of *Halal* signage

6. (1) No person shall use the word, logo or *Halal* or *Ditanggung Halal* signage without a certificate of *halal* issued by the Islamic Development Department of Malaysia, the Selangor Islamic Council or any other relevant authority.

(2) Any person who contravenes paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or both.

(3) The licencing authority may inspect the authenticity and validity of the aforesaid certificate and any person who fails to produce the certificate upon request made by the licencing authority shall be guilty of an offence.

PART III

LICENCE

Prohibition of displaying an advertisement without a licence

7. No person shall exhibit any advertisement without a licence issued by the licencing authority under this by-laws.

Application for licence

8. (1) Any application for the issuance or renewal of a licence shall be made in such form determined by the licensing authority and each application shall be accompanied with—

- (a) two copies of a sketch showing full details of the proposed advertisement;
- (b) site plan or location plan on the scale of 1:750 showing the location of the proposed advertisement;
- (c) a plan of the structure to be erected for the purpose of exhibiting the advertisement together with a certificate of a registered architect or a registered structural engineer certifying that the structure will be sound for the period which the advertisement is expected to be exhibited; and
- (d) a written assessment by a registered civil engineer or structural engineer as to the stability of the building or part of the building to which the advertisement will be affixed.

(2) The licensing authority may require an applicant to attend in person or, in the case of a corporation or firm, by a director or employee or any person authorized by the corporation or firm, at the time of the issuance or renewal of the licence.

(3) Upon approval of the application, the licensing authority shall issue a licence subject to—

- (a) payment of a deposit, such sum as the Council may determine;
- (b) payment of any fee as set out in the Schedule; and
- (c) any condition and restriction as may be specified therein.

(4) The licence shall be in such form as the licensing authority may determine with a reference number which shall be displayed on the advertisement.

(5) The licensing authority may issue a licence for a period not exceeding three years and is renewable, subject to an application for renewal being

made to the licensing authority and the payment of the fee set out in the Schedule.

Licence not transferable

9. A licence issued under this by-laws is not transferable.

Fee not refundable

10. Fee paid under this by-laws shall not be refundable.

Deposit

11. (1) The deposit paid under subparagraph 8(3)(a) shall not exceed ten thousand ringgit.

(2) The deposit shall serve as a security and shall be liable to forfeiture in whole or in part by the licensing authority for non-compliance of any provision of this by-laws or breach of any condition or restriction of the licence upon revocation of the licence.

(3) On the forfeiture of such deposit, the licence shall be deemed to have been revoked, unless the licencing authority, on application of the licensee, allow the licence to continue be in force subject to the repayment of the deposit that has been forfeited.

Suspension or revocation of licence

12. (1) The licencing authority may at any time suspend or revoke a licence if there has been non-compliance of any provision of this by-laws or a breach of any condition or restriction of the licence by giving a notice in writing to the licensee.

(2) The licensee shall remove the advertisement within thirty days after the receipt of the notice, failure of which shall be an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or to both.

(3) Notwithstanding paragraph (2), the licensee may appeal against the decision of the licencing authority within fourteen days of receipt of the notice and the licencing authority may suspend its decision under paragraph (1) pending the disposal of the appeal.

(4) The decision of the licencing authority shall be final.

Licence to be exhibited and produced

13. (1) A licensee shall exhibit his licence at all times at a conspicuous place and shall produce such licence if required to do so by the licencing authority or any authorized officer.

(2) A licensee who fails to exhibit or produce his licence under paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to both.

(3) For the purposes of this provision, a reference to a "licence" shall include a copy of a licence certified by the licensing authority to be a true copy of the licence.

Areas of advertisement

14. (1) An advertisement licenced under this by-laws shall only be exhibited at the places determined by the licencing authority.

(2) Any person who fails to comply with paragraph (1) shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment not exceeding one year or to both.

Exemption

15. (1) No licence shall be required for—

- (a) street numbers;
- (b) name plates on houses which indicate the name and or address of the occupant;
- (c) advertisement indicating hazardous materials, whether or not containing information about such material;
- (d) advertisements that provide instructions on how to enter or exit a property, or the sale, lease or rent of a property, use of equipment or security related information displayed on the relevant property or premises only and the size shall not exceed one square meter to convey sufficient information to the intended recipient;
- (e) any building or civil engineering contractor's signboard not exceeding three square meters in respect of a project carried on a property and displayed on that property only;
- (f) any official notices issued by the licencing authority, courts, public bodies or public officers in carrying out his duties;
- (g) official flags of Malaysia, any states in Malaysia, the licencing authority and foreign countries;
- (h) official flags of any firm, corporation, company, society, co-operative society or any other organization registered under the Registration of Business Act 1956, Companies Act 1965, Societies Act 1966 or Co-operatives Societies Act 1993 which are raised within the property of the same on approved posts; and
- (i) social community advertisements; and
- (j) any other advertisement which the licencing authority may determine from time to time.

(2) Only one advertisement shall be displayed in respect of advertisements exempted under paragraph (1) at one particular time and be subjected to by-laws 3, 18 and 19.

(3) The exemption granted under paragraph (1) may be revoked by the licencing authority at any time.

PART IV

MAINTENANCE OF ADVERTISEMENTS

Advertisement to be in good condition

16. All advertisement shall be maintained in a good, clean and satisfactory condition at all times.

Prohibited advertisements

17. The following advertisements are prohibited from being erected unless otherwise approved by the licencing authority:

- (a) advertisements which cause traffic hazard such as advertisements which use flashing or revolving lights, moving or variable images or lasers;
- (b) advertisements which resemble road and traffic advertisements or traffic signals;
- (c) advertisements which use reflective materials which may result in visual interference, advertisements which causes excessive levels of glare or light to a hazardous degree;
- (d) advertisements which obstruct the line of sight of any corner, bend, turning, intersection or vehicle crossing;
- (e) advertisements within the public right of way or which are attached to any public property;
- (f) advertisements which are animated, moving, swinging, rotating, flashing, blinking, scintillating, fluctuating, or contain variable images and include flood, fluorescent gel or laser lights except if the same are located at the areas specifically designated by the licencing authority;
- (g) advertisements which are not connected to the premises upon which the same are attached;
- (h) advertisements which have less than the horizontal or vertical clearance allowed from authorized communication or energized electrical power lines other than prescribed by the regulations or rules of the respective agencies concerned;
- (i) advertisements which are placed or form part of a roof or parapet of a building unless the same do not exceed the height of the existing rooflines;

- (j) advertisements which do not reflect the culture or lifestyle of the Malaysian community;
- (k) political advertisements; and
- (l) any other advertisements which the licencing authority may deem fit to prohibit from being erected or exhibited from time to time.

Projections

18. The projection of advertisements displayed on buildings shall be measured from the regular line of the street.

Safety

19. Any structure or fixtures erected for the purposes of displaying any advertisement shall be certified by a registered civil or structural engineer and such certification shall include the structural stability of the building or part of the building supporting the advertisements.

Maintenance

20. (1) The licencing authority may, by notice in writing, order any person erecting or exhibiting any advertisement to repaint, replace or clean the advertisement within such time as may be specified in the notice.

(2) If the advertisement is likely to cause confusion or annoyance to the public, the licencing authority may, by notice in writing, order the person exhibiting the advertisement to modify the said advertisement in such manner and within such time as may be specified in the notice.

Removal of advertisements

21. (1) The licencing authority may order the summary removal or erasure of any advertisement, including any structure erected specially for the advertisement, in the following circumstances:

- (a) where the advertisement and structures is in a dilapidated condition;
- (b) the advertisement is different from the one that was approved by the licencing authority; or
- (c) the advertisement is in contravention of any provision of this by-laws.

(2) The licencing authority or its authorized officers may enter into any premises at all reasonable times and execute the removal or erasure of any advertisement if the order of the summary removal or erasure of the advertisement under paragraph (1) has not been complied with.

(3) The expenses incurred for the removal or erasure of the advertisement under paragraph (2) shall be borne by the person erecting or exhibiting the advertisement or the owner or occupier of the premises on which the advertisement is erected or exhibited.

(4) The licencing authority may, for the purposes of repairing, repainting or cleaning any place or structure, remove any advertisement, even though the licence for such advertisement is still valid and no refund shall be made on the licensee in respect of such licence.

(5) The licencing authority shall not be responsible for any damage done by the licencing authority or any authorized officer in the course of carrying out the provisions under this by-laws.

PART V

ENFORCEMENT

Power to enter and inspect premises

22. (1) Any authorized officer may at any reasonable time—
- (a) enter and inspect any premises to make any enquiry or investigate any offence committed or suspected to have been committed;
 - (b) take any necessary step to remove any illegal advertisement or any advertisement in violation of this by-laws; or
 - (c) do any other acts necessary to give effect to any provision of this by-laws.
- (2) Any person who obstructs the licencing authority or any authorized officers commits an offence under this by-laws.

Power to investigate

23. The Mayor, President or any authorized officer may investigate any offence under this by-laws.

Search by warrant

24. (1) If it appears to a Magistrate, upon written information and after such inquiry as he deems necessary, that an offence under this by-laws has been committed or is being committed on or in respect of any premises, the Magistrate may issue a warrant authorizing any authorized officer named therein, to enter such premises with such assistance as may be required, and if necessary by force.
- (2) An authorized officer may, in the premises entered under paragraph (1), inspect—
- (a) any books, accounts or other documents, including computerized data, which contain or are reasonably suspected to contain information as to any offence suspected to have been committed; and
 - (b) any mark, signboard, card, letter, pamphlet, document, item, thing or goods that is reasonably believed to furnish evidence of the commission of such offence, and may seize any of such books,

accounts, documents or data or any copy of such books, accounts, documents or data or any such mark, signboard, card, letter, pamphlet, item, thing or goods.

(3) An authorized officer conducting a search under paragraph (1) may, if in his opinion it is reasonably necessary to do so for the purpose of investigating into the offence, search any person who is in or on such premises.

(4) An authorized officer making a search of a person under paragraph (3) may seize or take possession of any books, accounts, documents, things or goods found on such person for the purpose of the investigation being carried out by such officer.

(5) Where, by reason of their nature, size or amount, it is not practicable to remove any books, accounts, documents, things or goods seized under this section, the authorized officer making the seizure shall, by any means, seal such books, accounts, documents, things or goods in the premises or container in which they are found.

(6) A person who, without lawful authority breaks, tampers with or damages the seal referred to in paragraph (5) or removes any books, accounts, documents, things or goods under seal or attempts to do so, commits an offence.

Search without warrant

25. If the President or any authorized officer, in any circumstances referred to in by-laws 24, has reasonable cause to believe that by reason of delay in obtaining a search warrant under that by-laws the object of the search would be frustrated or the evidence of the commission of the offence is likely to be tampered with, removed, damaged or destroyed, such officer may enter the premises and exercise all the powers referred to in by-laws 24 in as full and ample a manner as if he were authorized to do so by a warrant issued under that section.

Search of female person

26. No female person shall be searched under by-laws 24 or 25 except by another female person and such search shall be conducted with strict regard to decency.

Power to require name, etc., to be given

27. President or any authorized officer may require any person whom he reasonably believes to have committed or has any connection with any offence under this by-laws to furnish his full name, identity card number, address and full particulars as the Mayor, President or authorized officer deems necessary.

Examination of person acquainted with case

28. (1) The President or any authorized officer, when exercising the power of investigation under this by-laws, may examine orally any person supposed to be acquainted with the facts and circumstances of the case.

(2) The person examined by the President or any authorized officer shall be legally bound to answer all questions relating to the case put to him, but such person may refuse to answer any question the answer to which would have a tendency to expose him to a criminal charge, penalty or forfeiture.

(3) A person making a statement under this section shall be legally bound to state the truth, whether or not such statement is made wholly or partly in answer to questions.

(4) The Mayor, President or authorized officer examining a person under this by-laws shall first inform that person of the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3).

(5) A statement made by a person under this by-laws shall, whenever possible, be reduced into writing and signed by the person making it or affixed with his thumb print after it has been read to him in the language in which he made it and he has been given an opportunity to make any corrections he may wish.

Power to arrest

29. (1) The President or any authorized officer may arrest without warrant any person—

- (a) whom he reasonably believes to have committed an offence under this by-laws; or
- (b) who refuses to give his name and address when it is requested for or if there is reason to doubt the accuracy of the name and the address given.

(2) A person arrested under this by-laws shall be taken to a police station and shall be brought before a Magistrate within twenty-four hours, unless before that time his true name and residence are ascertained, in which case such person shall be forthwith released on his executing a bond for his appearance before a Magistrate if so required.

(3) When any such person is taken before a Magistrate, such Magistrate may either require him to execute a bond, with or without a surety, for his appearance before a Magistrate if so required, or may order him to be detained in custody until he can be tried.

List of things seized

30. (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), where any books, accounts, documents, things or goods are seized under this by-laws, the authorized officer making the seizure shall prepare a list of the things seized and immediately

deliver a copy of the list signed by him to the licensee or the occupier of the premises which have been searched, or to the agent or servant of the licensee or occupier, at those premises.

(2) Where the premises are unoccupied, the authorized officer making the seizure shall post a list of the things seized conspicuously on the premises.

Things or goods subject to speedy and natural decay

31. (1) Where any things or goods seized in exercise of the powers conferred under this by-laws are of a perishable nature or are subject to speedy and natural decay or where the custody of such things or goods involves unreasonable expense and inconvenience, or is believed to cause obstruction or hazard to the public, the Mayor, President or the authorized officer may direct that such things or goods be sold at any time.

(2) President or the authorized officer shall not be liable to any person for any deterioration, however caused, in the quality of any things or goods seized under this by-laws.

Council not liable for loss or damage

32. The Council or any authorized officer enforcing any of this by-laws shall not be liable for any damage or any loss resulting from the said enforcement.

Obstruction, etc.

33. A person who—

- (a) assaults, obstructs, hinders or delays the Mayor, President or any authorized officer lawfully executing his duties under this by-laws;
- (b) fails to comply with any lawful demand, notice, order or requirement properly made to him by an authorized officer in the execution of his duty under this by-laws;
- (c) refuse any authorized officer access to any premises, or fails to submit to a search by a person authorized to search him under this by-laws;
- (d) omits, refuses or neglects to give to an authorized officer any information which may reasonably be required of him and which he is empowered to give;
- (e) furnishes false, untrue or misleading information to an authorized officer; or
- (f) fails to produce to, or conceals or attempts to conceal from, an authorized officer any books, accounts, documents, things or goods which such officer has reasonable grounds for suspecting were the subject-matter of or were used in the commission of an offence under this by-laws, or which are liable to seizure under this by-laws,

commits an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or to both.

PART VI

MISCELLANEOUS

Presumption

34. In any prosecution for an offence under this by-laws, it shall be presumed until the contrary is proved that—

- (a) any advertisement erected or exhibited on or in any premises was erected or exhibited by or with the permission of the owner or occupier of the premises;
- (b) any advertisement of any product was exhibited by the manufacturer of that product or, in the case of an imported product, by the local sole agent or distributor of the product; and
- (c) any advertisement of any event was exhibited by the promoter of that event or, where the promoter is not known, by the person to whom the proceeds of the sale of tickets for that event will be paid or by the person who stands to gain by such advertisement.

Prosecution

35. No prosecution shall be instituted for an offence under this by-laws except by or with the consent of the Public Prosecutor.

Compounding of offences

36. (1) The President, the Secretary or the Legal Officer of the Council may compound any offence committed by any person under this by-laws and prescribed to be a compoundable offence by making a written offer to the person suspected of having committed the offence to compound the offence upon payment to the Council of an amount of money not exceeding the amount of one thousand ringgit for that offence within the time specified in the offer.

(2) An offer under paragraph (1) may be made at any time after the offence has been committed but before any prosecution for it has been instituted, and if the amount specified in the offer is not paid within the period specified in the offer or within such extended period as the President, Secretary or Legal Officer may grant, prosecution for the offence may be instituted at any time after that against that person to whom the offer was made.

(3) If an offence has been compounded under paragraph (1), no prosecution shall be instituted after that in respect of the offence against the person to whom the offer to compound was made and anything seized in connection with the offence shall be released, subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed.

(4) All monies received under this by-laws shall be paid into the fund constituted under any law relating to local government.

Penalty

37. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand ringgit or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both such fine and imprisonment and in the case of a continuing offence to a fine not exceeding two hundred ringgit for each day during which such offence is continued after conviction.

Service of documents

38. Service or any notice, order, compound or document required to be served under this by-laws shall be effected by an officer authorized by the Council and the service may be effected by—

- (a) personally serving upon whom the notice, order, compound or document is issued;
- (b) leaving at the usual last known address of the person upon whom the notice, order, compound or document is issued in the event that personal service cannot be effected;
- (c) sending a copy by registered post addresses to the usual last known address; or
- (d) advertising in any daily newspaper.

Power to amend or repeal Schedule

39. The Council may add, amend or revoke all or any part of any schedule under this by-laws if it is of the opinion that it is necessary to do so.

Repeal

40. (1) Advertisement (Kuala Selangor District Council) By-Laws 1991 [P.U. Sel. 47/91] are hereby repealed.

(2) Any notice, order, compound, licence or documents made or issued under the repealed by-laws shall be deemed to be made or issued under this by-laws and shall continue to remain in force until revoked there under.
